Fishing

Fancy yourself as an angler? Enjoy yourself and have fun at the Bedok Reservoir fishing deck. Just a few house rules to observe:

- Use only artificial bait to maintain the reservoir's water quality.
- Practise catch and release to maintain fish stock in the reservoir.
- Use only carbon steel microbarb or barbless hooks and dispose all used hooks, lures and fishing lines properly.
- For the safety of visitors, please cast your lines with care and ensure children are accompanied by adults.
- Be considerate and ensure your actions do not cause harm to other visitors and yourself.

How we get our water

PUB is the national water agency that takes care of all our water matters. In Singapore, we get our water from four sources which we call the Four National Taps. These are rainfall that is stored at our reservoirs, imported water from Johor, NEWater and desalinated water (or purified seawater).

Conserving Water

Use water wisely through simple daily acts such as taking shorter showers, washing the car with a pail of water and watering the plants with a watering can instead of using a hose.

Valuing Water

Help keep our drains, canals and rivers clean by refraining from littering or throwing dirty water into them as they channel rainwater to our reservoirs.

Enjoying our Waters

By keeping our water catchment and reservoirs clean, we can have fun in the waters through activities such as kayaking, wakeboarding and sailing. We can also fish at the reservoirs but please do remember to release them back into the water so that the reservoir waters will always be full of life.

Spot These

Tembusu (*Fagraea fragrans*)

This beautiful, long-lived tree can reach 30m in height. The bark is distinctive dark brown and deeply fissured. It bears flowers twice a year producing creamy white flowers that turn yellow with age. The flowers give off a fragrant scent, especially in the evenings. The small berries ripen from orange to red and serves as a source of food for many animals such as birds and squirrels.

Did You Know?
This is the very species that is featured on the back of the Singapore five-dollar bill.



White-bellied Sea Eagle (*Haliaeetus leucogaster*)

The sea eagle is the largest bird-of-prey in Singapore. It has an impressive wingspan of 1.8m. Its head and underparts are pure white and the wings are grey. Also, it has a short, diamond-shaped white tail with a blackish base.



Striated / Little Heron (*Butorides striatus*)

Usually found moving around alone, the little heron has a greyish-black crown and cheek striped with whitish streaks at the upper part of the body. Its legs are yellowish-orange in colour.



Yellow Flame (*Peltophorum pterocarpum*)

The yellow flame is a beautiful, showy tree with wide spreading branches that can reach 30m in height. It has a light grey trunk that is slightly rough. The leaves have numerous leaflets and its flowers are yellow with wrinkled petals arranged in a cluster. The flattened winged fruit pod is purplish brown and contains up to 4 seeds. The pods tend to remain on the crown for several months before dropping off.

Did You Know?
A yellow-brown dye can be extracted from the bark and used for batik work and other purposes.



Collared Kingfisher (*Todiramphus chloris*)

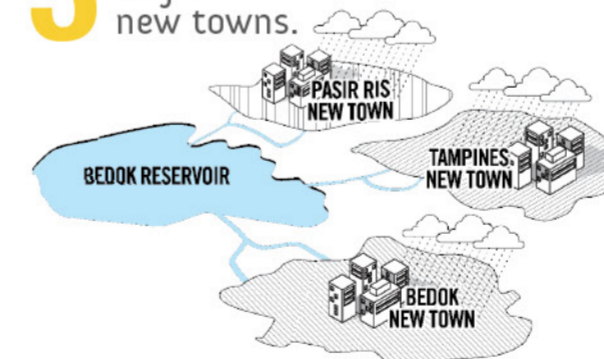
This coastal species has colonized the urban habitats in Singapore. While the name seems to suggest that it feeds on fish exclusively, this is not the case; this kingfisher is often seen catching insects when inland. The crown, back, wings and tail are blue above with variable turquoise. It has a broad, whitish collar and mostly dark bill and feet. It gives off a characteristic loud call (kek kek kek.).



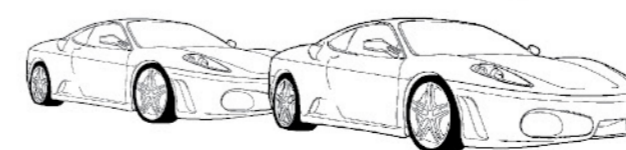
Interesting Facts

The reservoir gets its water from rainwater collected in drains and canals that flows from these

3 major new towns.



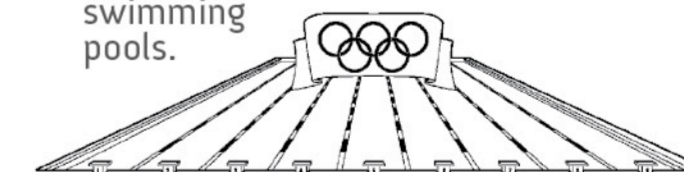
The reservoir has a perimeter of **4.3 kilometre**
That's about **1000** Ferraris lined together.



The deepest part of the reservoir is **18 metres**
This is more than the height of **10** average-built men.



The reservoir can store water enough to fill more than **5000** Olympic size swimming pools.



The size of the reservoir is about **135** football fields.



Play Your Part

The reservoir is made up of millions of water droplets that will eventually end up in your homes. To enjoy this water, we should take ownership of our water resources and keep our waterways clean.




- For your safety, swimming in the reservoir is prohibited.
- Dogs should be leashed when walking around the reservoir and they should not enter the water.
- Bin your litter in the nearest dustbin.
- Snub out your cigarette before entering the reservoir park to keep the air fresh.
- Use artificial baits when fishing and keep to the designated fishing area.
- Fishing lines rather than nets should be used for fishing.
- Animals at the reservoir like fishes, monkeys or birds need not be fed. They are capable of finding food for themselves.
- Do not release unwanted pets into the Reservoir

How to get to the Reservoir

1) If you are travelling by bus, these are the bus services available:

2) If you are driving, take the PIE to Changi Exit 8B Bedok Reservoir Road

3) If you are travelling by mrt, alight at Bedok station **EW5** and take these bus services from Bedok bus interchange,

- 18 69 168** alight at the bus stop outside the entrance
66 228 Any of the other bus stops shown
